# *It's official* CASTLE VALE IS A GREAT PLACE!

A visit by 15 national housing leaders from across the UK, including the Bishop of Manchester, visited the Vale and were wowed by what they saw and heard. Their mission was to find out what makes places great and how housing association landlords contributed to this. They have now visited housing estates in the North, Midlands and South of the country and will be shortly publishing a report and submitting this to government to influence national housing policy and future investment.



What they saw in Castle Vale was an estate that had been able to sustain the transformation that had been carried out by the Housing Action Trust, a locally based housing association delivering on-the-doorstep services backed up by a great community offer by a number of small and larger voluntary organisations. They were struck by how everyone pulled together and the voice and leadership role of tenants and residents in the governance of local organisations. Above all they were inspired by the presentation made by our young leaders – three pupils at Greenwood Academy.

## SOLAR PANELS

Those of you with an eagle eye may have seen our office has received attention recently as we take an exciting new step towards energy efficiency. Community Energy Birmingham has been working hard to install solar PV panels onto the roof of our head office which is expected to reduce the building's carbon footprint by a staggering 22 tonnes per annum! By reducing our

carbon emissions we are not only shaping our services to be more environmentally sustainable, but also generating savings of up to £43,000 over the life of the project. These funds will allow, not only us, but Castle Vale to be more resilient in the future.



## Community Organisers Awards

Residents from Tyburn, have recently been rewarded for the work they do to help improve connections in the local community. Volunteers from Community Organisers – a project set up by Ageing Better in Birmingham – received awards recognising their invaluable contribution to reducing isolation of individuals in the area. Awards and certificates were given to 16 locals, who have all taken steps to improve their neighbourhood. Through coffee mornings

and befriending services, these wonderful volunteers have made an impact on so many people's lives already. All their hard work is for free so it's important to us that we show every single one of them just how much we appreciate their efforts.

## Litter Picking

Led by the Estates Team at Castle Vale Community Housing, a team of volunteers from across the community embarked on a huge estate clean-up operation on 10 April 2019.

The clean-up was organised in support of The Great British Spring Clean, a campaign by Keep Britain Tidy to reduce litter, encourage recycling and improve the environment.

Over 70 people donned high-vis vests, grabbed litter pickers and black bags and gathered 146 bags of rubbish around the whole Castle Vale estate. After six and a half hours, the volunteers picked up the equivalent of a month and a half's worth of normal household rubbish.

As well as local residents and businesses, volunteers came from The Pioneer Group, local police, the Probation's Community Payback Team, Compass Support's Community Organisers, local football team Romulus FC, Green Fingers grounds maintenance, and included councillors Suzanne Webb and Robert Alden.

Following the clean-up operation, the Estates Team is embarking on an education campaign, encouraging residents to dispose of waste responsibly. So if you're interested in keeping your area clean, high-vis vests and litter pickers will be available from The Pioneer Group, 11 High Street, all year round.

## SERGEANT SPEAKS

You have probably seen in the local and national news the recent events surrounding knife crime and youth violence; unfortunately this was felt here in Birmingham with three murders of young men in a very short space of time. In Castle Vale, we had an incident where a man was stabbed last month. Two offenders were identified quickly and were both arrested the next day. The investigation is still taking place. In response, more stringent stop and search powers were authorised by Senior Officers, and Officers from the Tyburn team have been out enforcing them where possible. If you know of a young person who may carry a knife or hangs around with those who do, please let us know. There are lots of options open to young people and the last thing the police want is to have more injuries or people criminalised if they can be prevented in the first instance. Don't forget we're always happy to have a chat about your community concerns if you spot us in the street. This year, through various educational and community projects, we have planted over 200 trees. This included re-establishing vital hedgerows in partnership with The Wildlife Trust.

We have also hosted several HS2 corporate volunteer days in conjunction with Groundwork, which have seen lost pathways cleared, and overgrown areas managed to improve access for everyone to visit and enjoy. As the weather continues to improve, we will be delivering free seasonal family workshops, as well as holding free shared skill days at Castle Vale Allotments thanks to recent funding.

Both events will give the community an opportunity to learn more about what is happening within their local green open spaces and how we can protect our natural environment and its wildlife.

## KNIFE CRIME CAMPAIGN

From April 2019 Compass Support's Youth Team will be delivering work to raise awareness on knife crime within the local community.

Funded through the Police and Crime Commissioners, the team will be delivering a project called 'Cul-De-Sac' which will look at the risks and consequences of knife crime.

Each project is 8 weeks long and will be delivered in local schools and at The Sanctuary and at the end of each course, the young people will launch a campaign in the local area to raise awareness to their peers. Other elements of the work will include parent sessions, guest speakers, and targeted mentoring support.

During school holidays, youth workers will be working on the streets throughout the day and will have a live text service that can be texted if residents have concerns involving young people and the staff will visit the identified area.

## Castle Vale Library

Castle Vale Library is located on High Street and is open Monday and Tuesday 09:00-13:00 and 14:00-17:00, Thursday 09:00-13:00 and 14:00-18:00 and Saturday 09:00-15:00. In addition to the books available to borrow, a selection of books are available for sale at just 10p each. As well as a wealth of reading material, computers are available and the library offers a printing and photocopying service. A children's area is open with a range of age appropriate books, as well as a study area where free Wi-Fi is available.

## SWIMMING POOL FUNDRAISER



Castle Pool Community Partnership is a swimming pool run by volunteers and a small number of paid staff. The charity took over the running of the pool in 2014 as a community asset transfer, after campaigning to stop its closure by Birmingham City Council. The charity is now run by a small team of volunteers and paid staff.

On weekdays, we teach swimming to local schools between 8am and 3pm. We also run children's swimming lessons on Mondays, Tuesdays & Wednesdays at 4pm and Wednesdays at 4.30pm at a cost of £5 per week.

We have adult only swimming on Wednesday lunchtime 12-1pm costing £3 & family swimming on a Saturday afternoon costing £3 per adult & £2 for over 4's (under 4's are free)

We hire the pool and upstairs hall privately during the week to external companies and we are currently in the middle of a fundraising campaign as we need to raise funds for our plant room. One of our most recent fundraisers was a swimathon session and raffle with some goodies donated from The Pioneer Group.
